Notice of amended Travel advisory dated 30th August 2020

The current Section 9A notice, signed into effect from 12 May and still active, is as follows;

All persons are denied entry into the Cook Islands unless there is an exemption provided <u>(in</u> writing) by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Immigration.

Effective from **11.59pm Sunday 30th August 2020 (CKT)**, the following people are exempted for entry into the Cook Islands, provided they meet the entry criteria specified below;

- i. Cook Islanders (as verified via Cook Islands Status stamp)
- ii. Permanent Residents of the Cook Islands
- iii. Cook Islands work permit holders
- iv. Cook Islands resident permit holders

Entry criteria

- Must have spent the last 14 days in New Zealand prior to entry into the Cook Islands
- Must have confirmation of medical clearance from Te Marae Ora-Ministry of Health, verifying negative COVID-19 test result within the 96 hours (4 days) prior to travel to the Cook Islands.
- Comply with the Clinical and Medical criteria to be administered by Te Marae Ora and.
- Agree to supervised Quarantine in pre-approved residence on arrival into Rarotonga for a period of 14 days.

All requests for entry into the Cook Islands under this provision must be sought from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Immigration (*Te Kauono Tutara e te Mana Tiaki*) on email: immigration2@cookislands.gov.ck.

All travellers must comply with any NZ Government issued Border requirements and Approvals for entry into the Cook Islands and approval of entry will not be a means to bypass these requirements.

All travellers must ensure they are aware and comply with International Border requirements for entry and departure from the Cook Islands.

Te Kauono Tutara e te Mana Tiaki are working with Airlines and the Cook Islands Ministry of Health to manage this process to maintain the Cook islands status as a COVID free country and to ensure stringent Border security requirements are met for the safety of all our residents.
